Established in 1993, IMLU is a leading health, governance, and human rights Non-Governmental Organization registered in Kenya with a mandate to prevent and respond to torture and related violations. IMLU advocates for justice, healing, and accountability for victims of torture, driven by a commitment to upholding human rights and promoting a society free from torture.

### **Forensic documentation of torture**

IMLU works with professional investigators, pathologists, medics, and lawyers to provide scientific evidence for victims and survivors of torture.

### **Rescue and safety**

Where necessary, IMLU works with security apparatus to ensure the protection, rescue and safety of survivors and their families.

### **Rehabilitation**

IMLU provides holistic support, including medical and psychosocial services, to help survivors heal and reintegrate into society.

### **Litigation**

IMLU undertakes legal actions to hold perpetrators accountable and seek justice for victims of torture and related violations.

### **Advocacy**

IMLU promotes policy and legal reforms to prevent torture and improve the protection of human rights.

### **Capacity Building**

IMLU strengthens the capacity of state agencies and civil society organizations to respond effectively and professionally to torture and related human rights violations.

### **Research**

IMLU undertakes strategic research to inform and build a body of evidence for advocacy, policy, and programme design for evidence-based interventions
